

What is Safe Place?

Safe Place provides a network of locations where young people in crisis or at risk can get help quickly. Through the partnership of Payne County Youth Services and local businesses, Safe Place sites are located throughout the Payne County area. Safe Place is a project of Payne County Youth Services, Inc.

How Does Safe Place Work?

When a young person goes in a Safe Place and asks for help, an employee will call Payne County Youth Services. They will send a staff member or police who will immediately go to the Safe Place site to assist the youth. The staff will either take the youth to the shelter or take appropriate action.

Why Project Safe Place?

Some of the ways teens handle their problems are by running away, abusing substances, or attempting suicide. Through crisis intervention, Safe Place can help identify problems early. Safe Place is designed to easily and quickly provide emergency shelter, crisis intervention and counseling.

Safe Place also provides the assurance that when youth are away from home and find themselves in a helpless situation, crisis and shelter services are available. When a family is in crisis, it provides assistance.
